

Background. On March 5, 1770, eight British soldiers and their commanding officer found themselves trapped by an angry mob in front of the Customs House building in Boston, Massachusetts. The crowd threw snowballs, chunks of ice, and dared the soldiers to fire their weapons. Captain Thomas Preston tried to maintain the peace while he looked for a way to get his men to safety. Then a colonist threw a cudgel that struck soldier Hugh Montgomery and knocked him down. In response, Montgomery fired his musket. The other soldiers began firing their weapons sporadically. Three Bostonians died instantly, two died later, and six others survived their wounds. Captain Preston, who had just been struck on the shoulder by a colonist with a club, dashed in front of his men and ordered them not to fire.

The soldiers and their commanding officer went on trial for murder. A colonial jury found Preston and six other soldiers not guilty; two other soldiers were found guilty of manslaughter, branded on the thumbs, and released.
