**Background:** Under the Articles of Confederation, Congress passed in 1787 an ordinance that created the Northwest Territory for the purpose of selling land to settlers moving west. It also created a system of admission for new states into the Union and placed restrictions on slavery.

# An Ordinance for the government of the Territory of the United States northwest of the River Ohio

#### Article 5:

And, whenever any of the said States shall have sixty thousand free inhabitants therein, such State shall be admitted, by its delegates, into the Congress of the United States, on an equal footing with the original States in all respects whatever, and shall be at liberty to form a permanent constitution and State government: Provided, the constitution and government so to be formed, shall be republican, and in conformity to the principles contained in these articles....

#### Article 6:

There shall be neither slavery nor involuntary servitude in the said territory, otherwise than in the punishment of crimes whereof the party shall have been duly convicted: Provided, always, That any service is lawfully claimed in any one of the original States, such fugitive may be lawfully reclaimed and conveyed to the person claiming his or her labor or service as aforesaid.

Done by the United States, in Congress assembled, the 13th day of July, in the year of our Lord 1787....
